VE Day

This year on Friday 8th May people are remembering and celebrating 75 years after VE day.

What is VE day?

Victory in Europe (VE) Day on 8 May 1945 saw Britain and its Allies formally accept Nazi Germany's unconditional surrender after almost six years of war.

At 15:00, Prime Minister Winston Churchill announced on the radio that the war in Europe had come to an end, following Germany's surrender the day before.

St Mary's C of E School was affected by the war, 'In June 1942 a bomb had fallen on the school. 'During the night planes raided Penzance and dropped bombs on the Redinnick area. Of three unexploded bombs one entered the school through the roof of the hall and embedded in the floor. Fortunately, there were no casualties. The school re-opened after 9 days. The bomb was removed after 96 hours and it was then found that more time was necessary for workmen to do first said repairs to the school'

The school log for 8th May 1945 states '9th, 9th and 10th May 1945, School was closed for VE da celebrations'

I wonder if you have any old photos in your house of people in your family who celebrated VE Day in 1945?
