HALF TERMLY TOPIC GUIDE BOOKLET FOR PUPILS & PARENTS Spring 2nd Half Term 2019 Class 1.





This term Class 1's topic will be: 'Castles & Dragons.'

This unit of work will be based on where and how castles are built.

In **Science**, we will continue learning about materials. We will discover a variety of different materials. We investigate the best material to build a castle. Then we will report our findings to the King and Queen of St Mary's Castle.

In DT we will be designing, creating and evaluating our own castle. We will be cutting and gluing a solid wood base and buildings up using flexible and fixed joins. Finally we will make a working drawbridge.

In **Literacy**, we will be looking at quest stories involving dragons and knights. We will also make an information text about how to care for a dragon following some investigations.

We will also be exploring a new book as a class and using it to inspire some drama activities.

These are the 'I can' statements that the children will be working towards in **Maths** this half term:

Multiplication and Division

- Count in multiples of twos, fives and tens.
- Solve one step problems involving multiplication and division, by calculating the answer using concrete objects, pictorial representations and arrays with the support of the teacher.

Fractions

- Recognise, find and name a half as one of two equal parts of an object, shape or quantity.
- Recognise, find and name a quarter as one of four equal parts of an object, shape or quantity.

Addition and Subtraction

- Add and subtract one digit and two digit numbers to 20, including zero.
- Read, write and interpret mathematical statements involving addition
 (+), subtraction (-) and equals (=) signs.
- Solve one step problems that involve addition and subtraction, using concrete objects and pictorial representations and missing number problems.

In **RE**, we will continue to explore Hinduism and begin to recognise different Gods and Godesses that they worship, recognising that they believe one god is represented in many forms. The children will also become familiar with more Hindu stories.
