St Mary's C of E School is successfully narrowed gaps in attainment and progress for the majority of pupil premium children in 2014-15. This was due to successfully identifying gaps through termly pupil progress meetings to look at each individual child and his/her needs, ensuring effective intervention and and detailed tracking of pupil premium children

Our overall emphasis for 2015-16 will be:

- To improve progress and accelerated progress for Pupil Premium children to further close gaps in all year groups in Maths and Writing.
- Increased provision for Early Years and Year 1 to ensure barriers to learning are overcome sooner specifically focussing on improving Language and Communication scores
- To sustain attainment and accelerated progress in Reading for Pupil Premium children.
- Increase involvement of parents and carers in Pupil Premium progress reviews with parents to ensure involvement of all in child's learning (some of these will be SEN Pupil Individual Planning meetings with SENCo and Inclusion co-ordinator if child on GRIN as well as PP))
- Further Individualised approach to ensuring that high achieving PP children are given opportunities to further develop e.g. provision for instrumental lessons.
