Our reading skill of the month:

The children have been working hard to improve their understanding of the texts that they read. We use 'Reading VIPERS' to do this. One of the skills we have focused on this month is 'Inferring'. This is when the answer to a question is not directly in the text, however we can use the evidence, or clues, in the text to help us. Once we have found the evidence, then we can use our own experiences and understanding of the world to come up with an answer. Have a go with the picture below.

- Why is the girl standing behind him?
- Why is she dragging a kite on the floor?
- Has she said anything to him? Does he know she's there?

Our language development tip of the month:

EYFS— Encourage your child to join in with familiar phrases or actions with stories that they listen to.

KS1— share other words that mean the same thing as a word your child uses— this will develop their vocabulary. E.g. enormous, large, huge.

KS2: encourage your child to use the context of a sentence to understand the meaning of an unfamiliar word.
